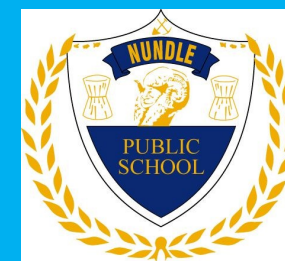

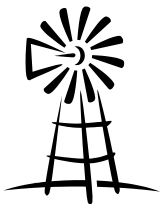
based on *The Deep* by Tim Winton
