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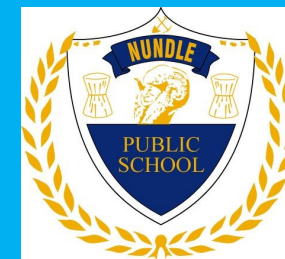

Principal's Message continued:

Congratulations to Mrs Weis and our S.R.C. for the very successful High Tea they catered as a thankyou to all of the lady knitters who came into school over the past many weeks, to assist students with their winter scarves. Again, I would also like to thank the Nundle Woollen Mill and the proprietors Nick and Kylie Bradford for donating the wool to the school for this activity. It has been well received by students with many of them continuing their knitting.

We have already started to look into next year. Nundle Public School will start attracting Low SES funding as of 2012. This funding will be given to the school for 4 years. It amounts to \$1000 dollars per child each year. Maintaining numbers at around 60 means we will receive approximately \$60,000 each year for the next 4 years. This is a great boost to the school budget. With this in mind, there will be a number of surveys coming home in relation to improvements we can make at the school. It would be appreciated if these could be filled in and returned to the school. We need to complete a situational analysis to receive our funding. Part of our plans for next year are to change our class structures slightly. The following will apply;
