They will need to take their fruit, recess, lunch and water bottle with them in a plastic bag marked with their name.



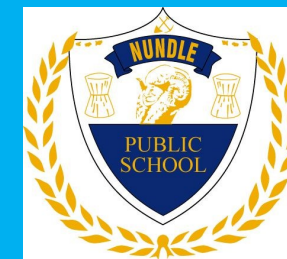
