Principal's Message continued:

During the last week of term we have the Royal Far West mobile clinic visiting the school. This is a great opportunity for specialists to work with children. I have sent a number of notes home in relation to this. If these forms could be filled in and returned asap that would be great.

I have sent home a number of attendance letters this week. We are required by law to monitor the attendance of children at school. It is a legal requirement that students attend school and we are bound by legislation to follow up on attendance. To get the most from school, students should be in attendance at least 95-100% of the time. It is required by law, that students do not attend school less then 85% of the time. Students who do fall below this rate are required to produce official evidence as to their absence.

Thank you to Mrs Warden for her work organising the raffle for the year 6 farewell. I know a number of students have already sold their tickets and returned them to Mrs Warden. Mrs Warden will be on leave over the last week of term and Mrs Carol Swain will be relieving as SAM during this period of time.


