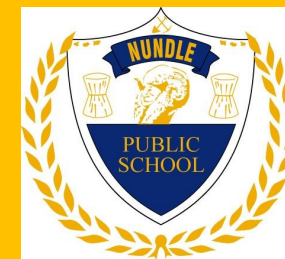

Principal's Message continued:

Once again, if you have any concerns or would just like an update as to how your student is going, please contact your student's class teacher.

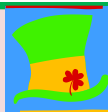
