

4/5/6 electives

In week 2, 4/5/6 made a healthy corn omelette, Jackson Worley, Ebony Brand, Nikita Eveleigh and Brent Thompson cooked the omelette. It was a delicious meal. Recipe for healthy corn omelette:

Ingredients

- 3 ears of corn, husked
- 4 ½ tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 ½ teaspoons salt
- ¼ teaspoon black pepper
- 4 large eggs, separated
- 1 tablespoons finely chopped fresh chives



Method: Put oven rack in middle position and preheat oven to 350°F.

Melt butter in a 10-inch ovenproof nonstick skillet (preferably lightweight) and remove skillet from heat, then transfer 3 tablespoons melted butter to bowl with corn (leaving remaining butter in skillet to cool). Toss corn to coat and stir in 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon pepper.

Whisk egg yolks with remaining 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon pepper in a large bowl until combined. Beat whites with a pinch of salt in another bowl using an electric mixer at medium speed until they just hold stiff peaks. Fold one third of whites into yolks to lighten, then fold in remaining whites gently but thoroughly. Gently fold in corn mixture.

Spoon mixture into skillet and bake until pale golden and set, 10 to 12 minutes. Loosen omelette with a heatproof rubber spatula and slide onto a plate. Serve sprinkled with chives.

Grilling Procedure

If using a charcoal grill, open vents on bottom of grill, then light charcoal. When charcoal turns grayish white (about 15 minutes from lighting), hold your hand 5 inches above grill rack to determine heat for charcoal as follows:

Hot: When you can hold your hand there for 1 to 2 seconds

Medium-hot: 3 to 4 seconds

Low: 5 to 6 seconds

If using a gas grill, preheat burners on high, covered, 10 minutes, then, if necessary, reduce to heat specified in recipe.

Add corn to a 4-quart pot of boiling salted water, then remove from heat and let stand, covered, 10 minutes. Drain and, when cool enough to handle, cut kernels from cobs with a


I am in a desert. To make my cactus I used rectangles and twisted them around and for the spikes I used tiny little moons.

To get the shapes I went onto Microsoft Word and went to insert and then went to shapes and then I got my shape.






