We are looking forward to the Book Week Parade and being able to wear a costume at school.


Year 5/6 Class Report

In Mrs. Sutherland's class, Year 5/6 has role-played a circuit diagram in Science and will experiment with various types of insulators and conductors next week. In Literacy we have completed our oral presentations on the Nanberry text and are constructing our multimodal presentations before moving onto the persuasive essay work involving Rikki Tikki Tavi. We also played a vigorously competitive game of hockey and Aus Tag during PE.

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Year 1 and 2

Another fortnight has passed and we find ourselves halfway through term 3. In literacy students have continued to learn about different genres, focusing on fables. Students have learnt that fables not only entertain the reader but also teach the reader an important lesson. This week we have focused on planning for writing. Understanding that writing is a process that involves the steps of planning, writing, editing and publishing a piece of text. Students have taken the time to plan their characters, setting, complication and resolution for their story before beginning the writing process.



In math's they have enjoyed learning about chance and data. Students have conducted surveys and are learning to represent the collected data in a graph. They have also been introduced to division and have enjoyed some hands on investigations to help with understanding this new concept.

In preparing for book week, students have produced some very menacing looking piranhas. These piranhas are characters in one of the class' favourite books, 'Piranhas Don't Eat Bananas' by Aaron Blabbley. It tells the story of Brian, the vegetarian piranha who has no luck in convincing his mates that bananas are awesome.



Year 3/4 Class Report

In English we have started Literature Circles. We read novels and do activities relating to the book. Then once a week we meet to discuss our novel. Vote taken everyone is enjoying Literature Circles. We have also been working with informative texts about Antarctica. We have been researching about different species of Penguins and writing information reports. In Math's we have been working with fractions and decimals. In science we have become citizen scientists. We have been assisting scientists to identify wildlife in photos taken throughout Australia. We made sun dials in science and have a much better understanding of how the sun, moon and earth work together.
