Tamworth Bird Watchers unveiled a birdwatching noticeboard at Sheba Dam last Wednesday and they were kind enough to invite our Year 4/5/6 students along for the morning. The students got to participate in some birdwatching, perfecting the art of using binoculars, with the support of the bird watching members to identify bird species as part of an annual birdcount. The birdcount is established to monitor the movements of a variety of species of birds across the country. It was a fantastic morning out that was matched by a brief historical tour of Hanging Rock from Marcia Ajani. The students inspected the cemetery and learnt about the previous buildings that used to stand in the original village of Hanging Rock.
