**\$100 voucher for your child's arts, music & dance lessons**

\$100 Active Kids and Creative Kids vouchers are now available to claim online.

The Creative Kids voucher can be used as part payment towards to your child's school music lesson.

To claim your voucher you need to login to your MyServiceNSW Account. Click on the Active Kids icon, fill out the required information - you will need your Medicare card, and print out a copy of your voucher and give it to the school office.

If you require assistance with claiming your voucher please contact the school office and make a time to come in and we can help you.

You receive ONE Creative Kids voucher per year and TWO Active Kids vouchers per year. One for use in Term 1 and 2 and the other for use in Term 3 and 4.



All NSW school-enrolled children are eligible for **two \$100 Active Kids vouchers**. The vouchers can be used with any approved Active Kids provider, to help cover costs towards registration or membership fees for sport and active recreation. **Voucher one is valid January to December** and **voucher two is valid July to December**. After 1 July 2019, the second voucher can be claimed immediately after the first voucher.

**How to claim your vouchers**



**1** Visit [service.nsw.gov.au](http://service.nsw.gov.au) and login to your MyServiceNSW Account



**2** Click on the Active Kids icon found in your SERVICE tab



**3** Fill out the requested information (you will need your current Medicare card)



**4** Print a copy of each voucher or email it to yourself

- Don't forget to add an **ice brick** to keep the food cool and safe

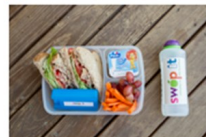
