RUSTLESS SALMON OUICHE Cooking time: 40 m Prep time: 10 mins Ingredients 2 tsp olive oil 1 small onion, diced 1 zucchini, grated 1/2 cup frozen peas 6 eggs 185 g tin pink salmon, drain ½ cup reduced fat milk

1 cup baby spinach 1/3 cup reduced fat cheese tbsp parsley, chopped 1 tbsp dill, chopped (optional)

Step 1: Pre-heat the oven to 180°C. Grease a guiche dish with olive oil. Step 2: Heat olive oil over medium heat in a frypan. Cook the onion until it's soft. Add the zucchini and peas and cook for a further 2 minutes. Set aside. Step 3: Whisk together the eggs, milk and herbs in a large bowl. Add the or mixture and stir.

Step 4: Pour half the mixture into the quiche dish, top with the baby spinach on then pour the remaining mix over the top. Sprinkle with cheese Step 5: Bake for 30-40 minutes or until set.
